

# PRINCE GEORGE AUTHORITIES REPORT NO SLAYING LEADS

Prince George County authorities say they have no leads in the stabbing death of a 56-year-old county woman in her home Sunday night.

Officers responding to a call from Joyce S. Aldridge of 4105 Montreal Avenue in the county found her dead of stab wounds Sunday at 11:43 p.m. An intruder had kicked open the locked door to a bedroom where she apparently had retreated, according to a spokesman for the Prince George Sheriff's Department.

Mrs. Aldridge had called a telephone operator, who transferred the call to the sheriff's department. The dispatcher was able to make out the address but nothing more, the spokesman said. Eight minutes later, she was found dead.

The front door and front screen door both were open, the spokesman said, with no sign of forced entry. There was no sign of robbery, he said. Mrs. Aldridge reportedly kept very little money around, the spokesman said.

Officers planned to meet with officials at the state medical examiner's office in Richmond today.
